 - a. President Van Dermark provides welcoming remarks on the first year of the Senate and the graduates of CT State.

 - i. Provost Brown introduces the topic before Deans DiMattio and Stefanowicz talk about the Presentation. Dean Stefanowicz provides update progress of APP over the course of the academic year 2023-2024.
- b. DRAFT Dual Enrollment Policy & Procedure CSCU Karen Hynick (10 minutes)
 - CEO Hynick provides an overall of the draft dual enrollment policy documents.
 The policy documents provide context to the enrollment of dually enrolled students, faculty credentialing, and other aspects of the policy.

 - VP Davis, Kelley, and President Jukoski conduct a PowerPoint presentation for the Senate on FA and Student Workers. The College Senate asks questions after the presentation.

7. Recommendations from Senate Committees

- a. Course Caps & Cancellation Taskforce Angelo Glaviano (30 min)
 - Sen. Glaviano provides context and updates from the Course Caps and Cancellation taskforce. Sen. Glaviano makes a motion to endorse the proposed recommendations from the task force and send to CT State leadership.
 - 1. Sen. Sollivan seconds the motion.
 - a. The Senators discuss the motion.
 - i. Sen. Prior makes a friendly motion to discuss each recommendation one-by-one.
 - ii. Sen. Glaviano agrees, Sen. Sollivan disagrees. Motion is not agreed upon.

- recommendations from the task force and send to CT State leadership for constructive collaboration to bring transparency and faculty leadership to the processes. Sen. Sollivan and Glaviano agree.
